BY-LAWS**IN CAMERA REPORTS**

IC280/11 -Loan- Peel Children’s Safety Village – The Board considered a report dated October 25, 2011 from Mr. F. Biro, Executive Director, providing the Board with detailed information with respect to a loan to the Peel Children’s Safety Village which would allow for construction to be commenced , with the classroom becoming operational in the first half of 2012.

WHEREAS the Peel Children’s Safety Village was and is a community initiative to provide traffic related safety training to the youth of Peel Region;

and WHEREAS the Region of Peel has taken a leadership role in its support of the concept and construction of the initial facility;

and WHEREAS the Regional Municipality of Peel Police Services Board and the Peel Regional Police have been a strong supporter and partner in this initiative since its inception, specifically the Peel Regional Police has provided and continues to provide personnel at no cost, and at the required level to the Village, since its opening to provide training to the children;

and WHEREAS this initiative has resulted in significant and meaningful results, including but not limited to recorded incidents where two children have avoided tragic situation because of training at the Village;

and WHEREAS it is recognized that an additional classroom will result in double the capacity of the Village, which acknowledges the growth in the Region of Peel and will allow the training of many more children on matter such as traffic safety, cyber bullying, internet safety;

and WHEREAS it is for this reason that an event was held earlier this year, in honour of Chief Metcalf's forty years of service to the Peel community; an event supported by Emil Kolb's Hootenanny, which has had the children of Peel as its primary focus for fund raising over the past decade;

and WHEREAS the event to honour Chief Metcalf raised in excess of \$340,000 for the new classroom;

and WHEREAS the Board's repayable grant will result in the additional classroom being constructed at least seven years prior as opposed to fund raising for the addition prior to commencing construction;

and WHEREAS the Board's contribution is a repayable grant, so the Board's capacity to support other community initiatives will not be impaired;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that, subject to achieving terms agreeable to the Board and the Board of Directors of the Peel Children's Safety Village, the Board provide a repayable grant from the Community Resources and Recognition Fund to a maximum of \$180,000 for the construction of an additional classroom at the Village;

Further, that the repayable grant be returned to the Fund over no more than a nine-year period, with a minimum return of no less than \$20,000 per year;

Further that this item be reported back on the public agenda.
