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OPIOIDS

Definition:

 > substances that act on opioid receptors to produce morphinelike or euphoric effects
> Medically used for pain relief



LICIT FENTANYL

- > Synthesized in 1950's for surgery & pain management
- Most commonly seen in transdermal (through the skin) patches.
- > Also seen in the form of lozenges, sprays, liquid







ILLICIT FENTANYL

- > Health crisis
- Majority of illicit fentanyl comes from China and to a lesser extent Mexico
- Can be absorbed through the skin or any mucous membranes (eyes, mouth, etc)
- Very dangerous







HEROIN vs FENTANYL LETHAL DOSE



- Slurred speech
- Severe drowsiness
- Slowed heartbeat
- Low blood pressure
- Unsteady on feet
- Respiratory distress



CARFENTANIL & W18

<u>Carfentanil</u>

- > 100x fentanyl
- > used to tranquilize large game animals
- > less than a grain of salt can be fatal to humans

<u>W18</u>

- > 100x fentanyl
- > Discovered at the University of Alberta in 1982.
- Recent testing suggests that the compound is an analgesic and not an opioid (Naloxone has no effect)



NALOXONE

> Issued to PRP personnel in June 2017

- >Nasal spray
- > Opioid antagonist blocks opiate receptors in the brain.
- > Reverses opioid overdose
- > Has been used by officers
