## NEW BUSINESS

2. **OPP – 2023 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Operations/Statistical Analysis Report** – The Board considered the 2023 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Operations Summary and Statistical Analysis report with respect to policing the Town of Caledon as provided to the Board by Inspector M.L. Kearns, OPP Caledon Detachment Commander. The reports provide statistics and analysis for October 2023 – December 2023 for the following areas:

- Public Complaints
- Motor Vehicle Collisions
- Criminal Code and Provincial Statute Charges Laid
- Violent Crime
- Property Crime
- Drug Crime
- Clearance Rates

Inspector Kearns reported that during the last quarter of 2023, three public complaints were received. The traffic report detailed four fatal motor vehicle collisions between October and December, resulting in five fatalities, with three occurring in December due to head-on impacts, attributed to speeding, lack of seatbelt use, and driver inattention. There has been a noticeable increase in fatal collisions on Caledon roadways.

She highlighted that the OPP is actively working to enhance road safety in collaboration with Peel Regional Police and reviews fatal collisions with the Peel Regional Vision Zero Fatal Collision Review Committee. During the Thanksgiving weekend, Operation Impact issued 298 notices for major traffic offenses. The festive RIDE campaign led to 46 impaired drivers being apprehended.

In terms of violent crime, there was a decrease in robberies but a slight increase in sexual assault investigations. A notable incident involved an attempted murder of two Caledon OPP officers by occupants of a stolen vehicle. Kearns also noted an uptick in home invasions and carjackings, with successful operations against these crimes leading to several arrests.

Drug crime rates remained stable, although there was an increase in possession charges, mostly detected during traffic stops. Kearns concluded by announcing that three experienced officers and three new recruits have joined the Caledon OPP, bolstering the detachment's capabilities.
