Aim is to strengthen democracy, human rights, the rule of law, and advance Canadian values and interests.




Canada aids in building a more secure world



History of Canada and Peace OPS



Canada has been deploying police officers to peace missions around the world since 1989



Contributing police services; Provincial, Municipal, Regional, and Indigenous

Over 4,000 Canadian police officers have been deployed to over 33 countries, including Sudan, Kosovo, West Bank, Haiti, and Afghanistan

Training, Investigating, advising, and mentoring local police



Types of Missions



Deployed Canadian police carry out the following types of Missions:



International Peace & Stabilization Operations

- United Nations (UN)
- European Union (EU)



Bilateral deployments

International Criminal Courts/ Tribunals, as well as, Commissions/Inquiries
